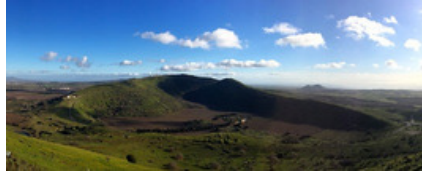


250000 BC - Volcanic time - Let's agree to call it a restart
